Colour-in the water safety rules that keep you safe at the beach and pool.



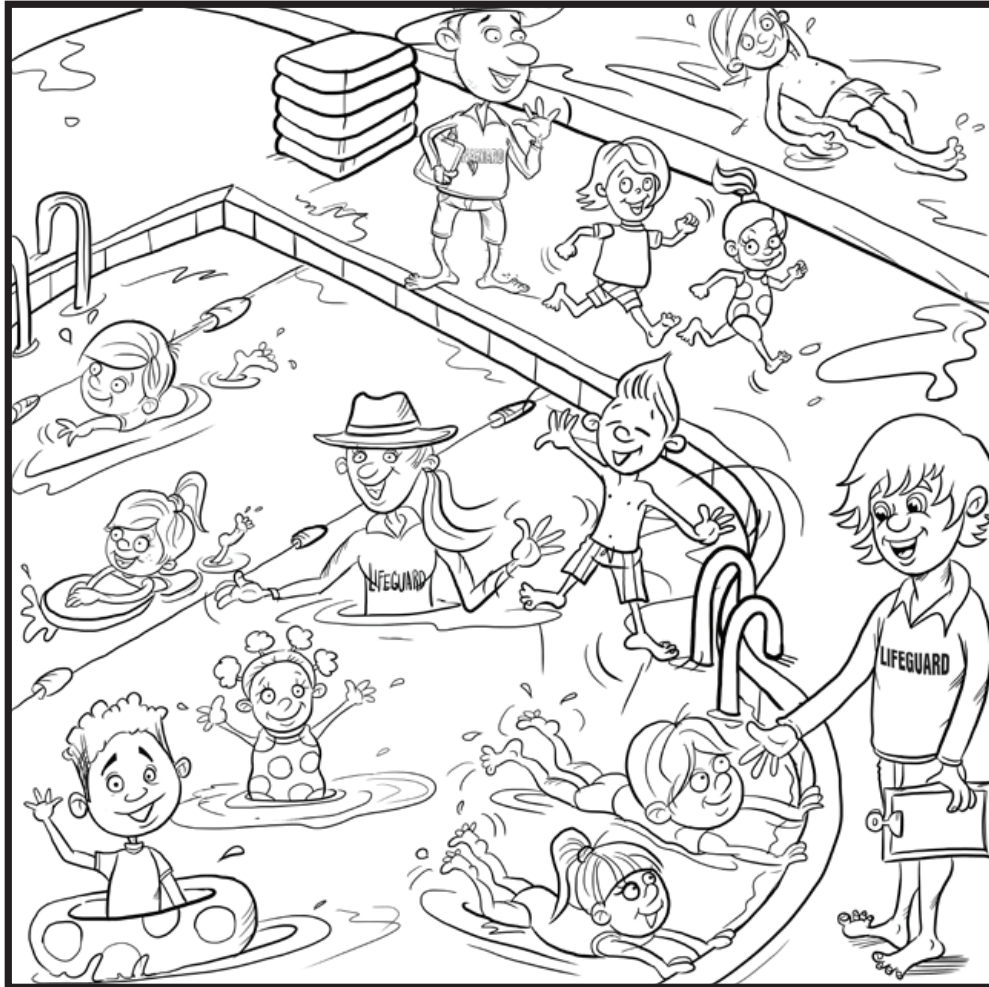
NEVER SWIM ALONE

BEACH FLAGS

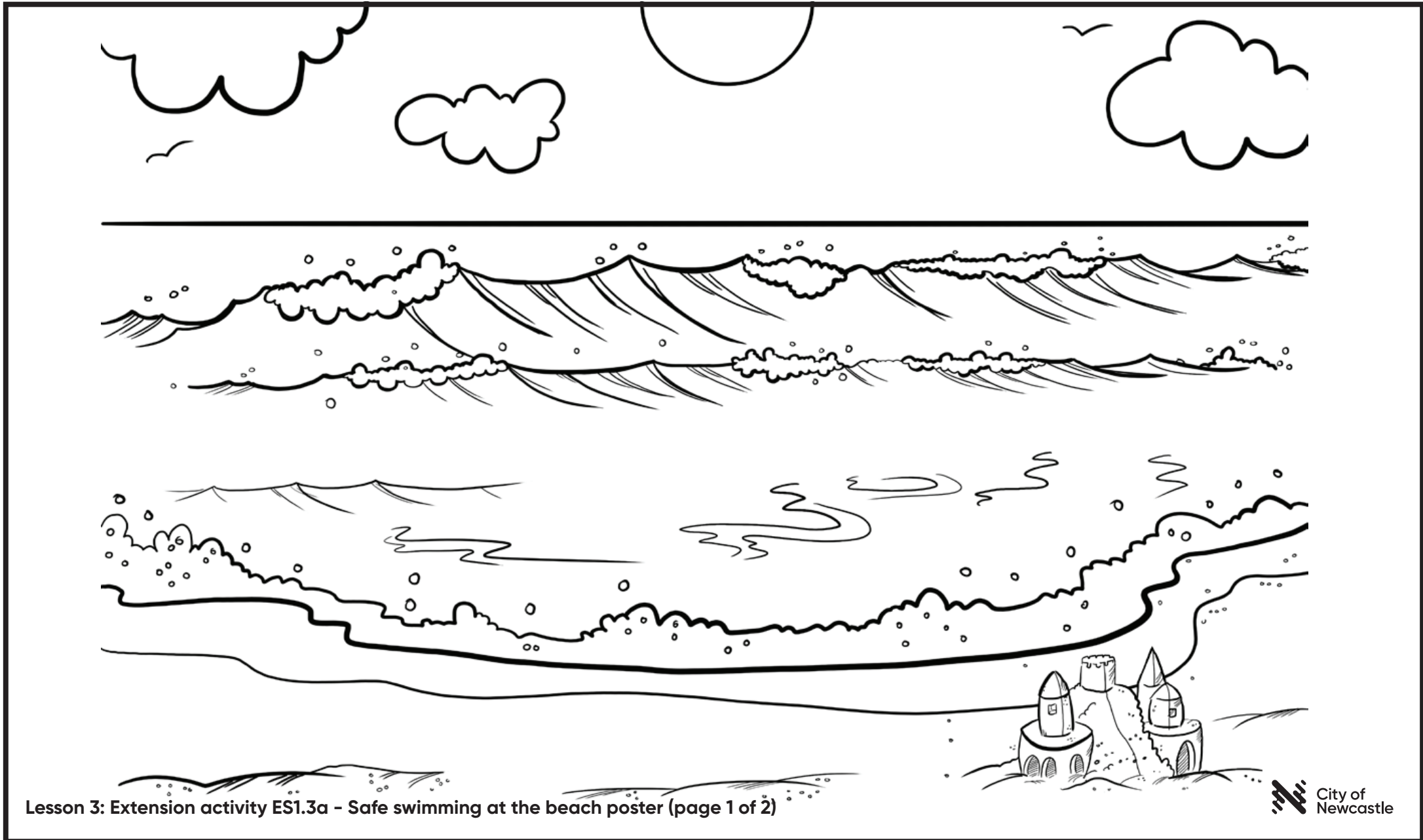
Colour in the beach flags using these numbers: 1 = RED, 2 = YELLOW, 3 = BLACK
